

Bengaluru golfers on course to play in national-level tournament

The Indian edition of the Audi quattro Cup concluded at Prestige Golfshire with Audi Bengaluru hosting the second leg of the ninth edition of the tournament over two days. The tournament saw the participation of around 1,500 golfers and was held across 10 other cities, making it a nation-wide event over a total of 13 legs.

Hitesh and Chandraprakash joined first-round winners, V Theertha Prasad and Karan Singhvi, who will be playing the national final.
